Introduction

This annual report gives a glimpse of another milestone in operationalizing the four-fold mandates along instruction, research, extension, and production. Born of a collective commitment and through the continuing effort of the College President Dr. Dammang S. Bantala, CCSPC goals were molded into real commitments to provide quality services for the students.

On the issue of student development, the recently released result of the PRC Licensure Examination for Social Worker has placed CCSPC in the limelight. Hubaib Mundas Midtemeg, with an average score of 84.50%, ranked 9 in the said Licensure Examination conducted last July 2015. Notably, the passing rate of the first takers was 72.19%. This is higher than the national passing rate of 68.46%.

Concerning accreditation, twenty two (22) or 91.69% of academic programs were already AACCUP accredited. Three (3) of the Graduate programs such as Master of Public Administration, Master of Arts in Education and Master of Science in Agricultural Extension were Level III accredited. In the Baccalaureate Programs, seven (7) were accredited under Level II and another twelve (12) under Level I. Moreover, two (2) academic programs were considered candidates.

On the Linkages of the Administration, the College has successfully established linkages with seven (7) regional, five (5) national and three (3) international entities. All of these have been approved by the Board of Trustees (BOT).

This *2015 Annual Report* highlights the various events, performances, and notable accomplishments of the College during the year under review which include the preparation of accreditations of the different graduate and undergraduate programs, Students Achievements, Students Organizations and many others.

Brief History

Cotabato City State Polytechnic College (CCSPC) started as a general secondary school in 1924 known as Cotabato High School. In 1975, it became Cotabato City High School funded by the Cotabato City government. Two years later, it was converted into Cotabato City National High School (CCNHS). On June 10, 1983, by virtue of Batas Pambansa Blg. 484, CCNHS was converted into state college to be known as *Cotabato CityState Polytechnic College*. Its basic functions are instruction, research, extension and production.

CCSPC commenced offering a three-year non-degree program during the second semester of school year 1983-84 with 153 first year students. After almost three decades of existence, CCSPC now offers three (3) Pre-Baccalaureate Courses, 22 Baccalaureate, five (5) Master's, four (4) Doctorate Programs and a Laboratory High School (LHS). Based on the last enrolment of students (First Semester of School Year 2013-2014) in all colleges including LHS, the number has soared to 8,444. Manned by 349 competent and dedicated faculty members and administrative staff, CCSPC has significantly contributed to the development of the community by providing quality education to its graduates.

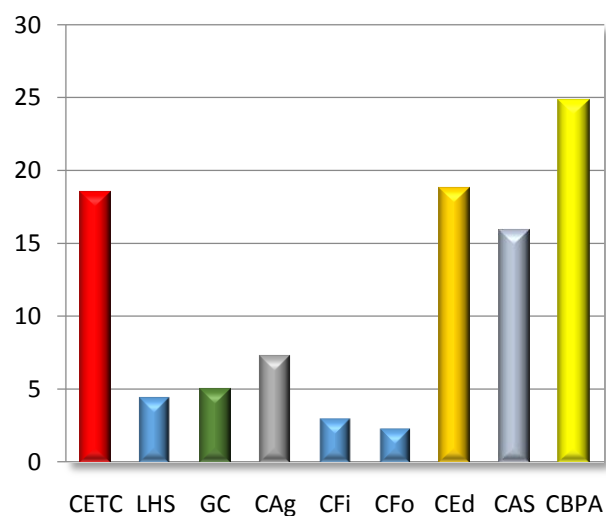

Number of Graduates per College and Course

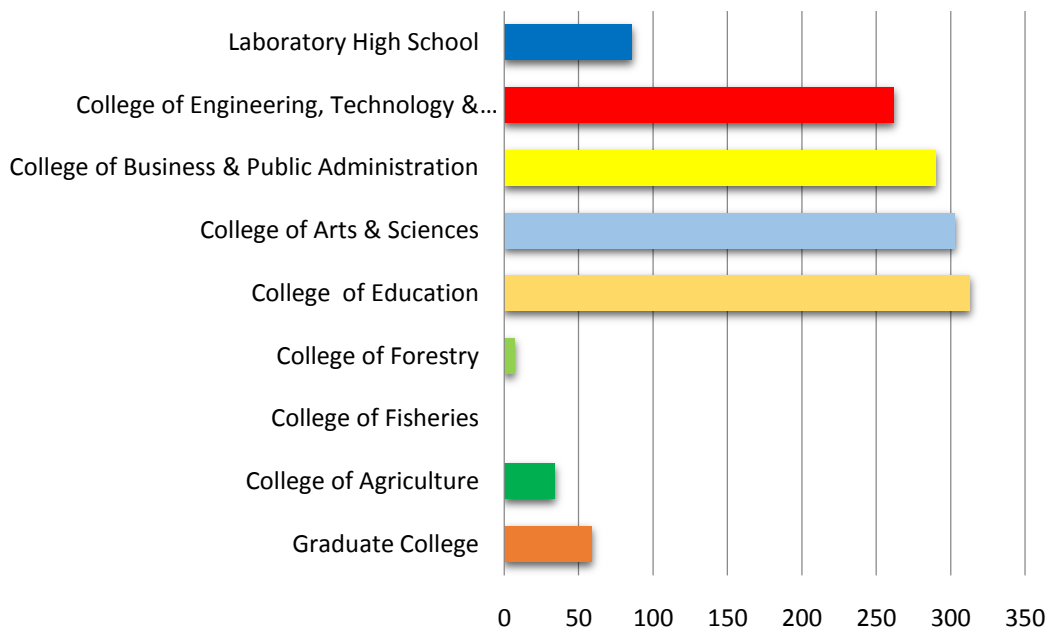

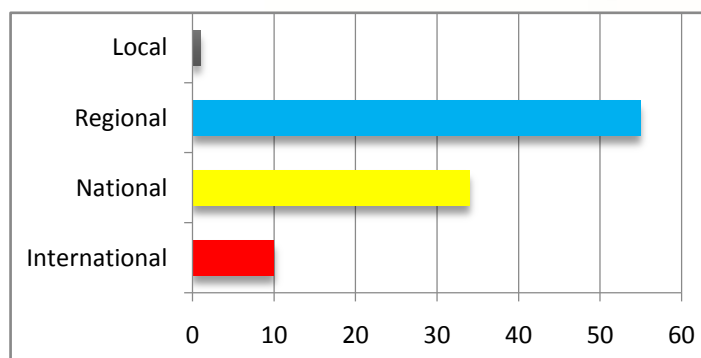

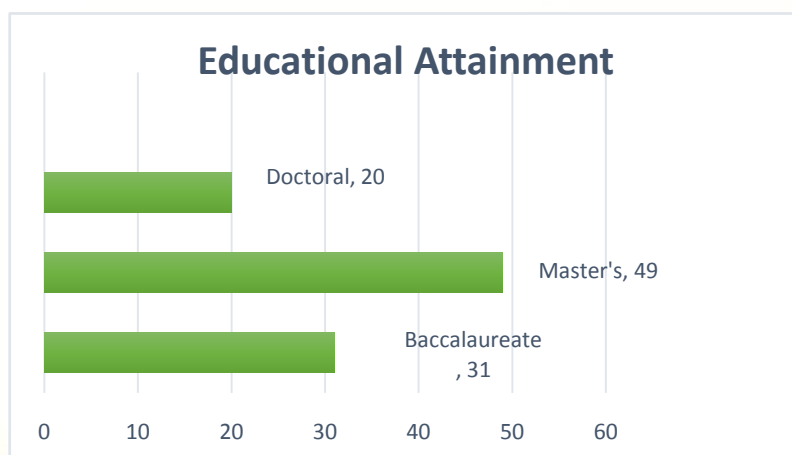

Faculty Profile by Degree and Ranks

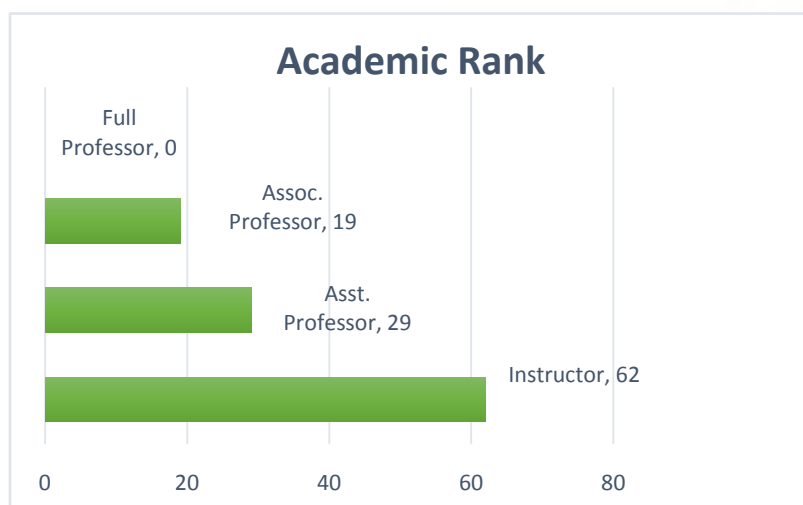

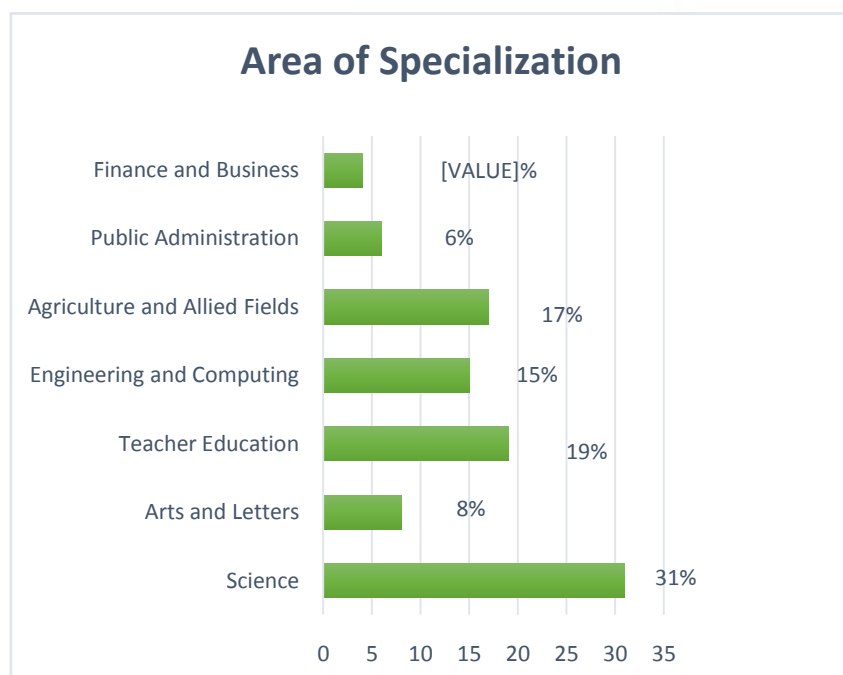
Based on Academic Rank

Based on Area of Specialization

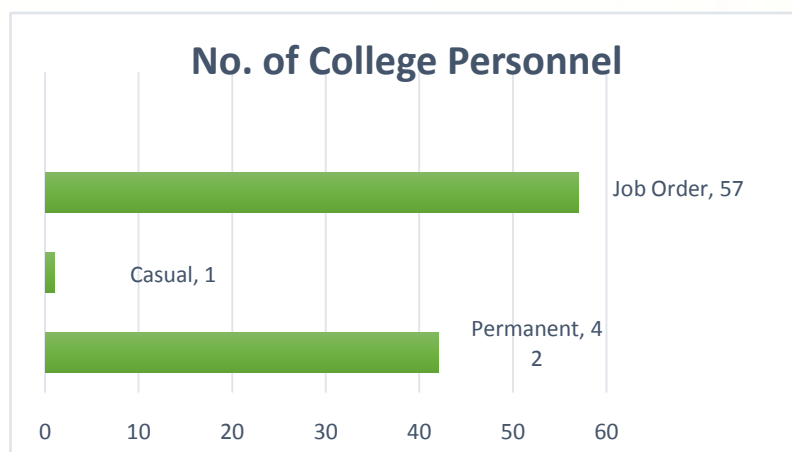
